

## The Cost of Infant & Toddler Care in Madison County

The following information has been collected from local child care centers and family child care programs. It is based on weekly, full-time child care rates. Keep in mind that rates are determined by each child care program. Parents should ask about the cost of child care during interviews. Child care programs may offer grants or scholarships, use a sliding fee scale or offer a multi-child discount. You may also be able to receive financial assistance through your local Department of Social Services.
